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



Jafar Jafari is an Emeritus Professor of Hospitality and Tourism at the University of Wisconsin-Stout, Department of Hospitality and Tourism (USA). He came to this position trained as a cultural anthropologist (PhD, University of Minnesota, USA) and as hotel administration graduate (BS and MS, Cornell University, USA), bringing with him additionally an honorary doctorate from the Universitat de les Illes Balears (Spain). Jafar's contributions to the academic community span international boundaries and institutions. # Qualitative Research Results And Discussion Writing

On 17th June 2022, Friday, from 1.00 pm to 2:00 pm Malaysian Time (GMT +8), the Centre for Research and Innovation in Tourism (CRiT) happily joined hands with the School of Hospitality, Tourism and Events (SHTE), Taylor's University, Malaysia during the Post Graduate Alumnus sharing session on "Qualitative Research Results And Discussion Writing" by Dr. Benjamin Appiah Osei, the alumnus from SHTE class of 2020. Dr Benjamin is a lecturer in Hospitality and Tourism Management at the Department of Human Resource and Organizational Development at the School of Business in Kwme Nkrumah University of Science and Technology (KNSUT), Ghana.

At the beginning of the workshop, Dr. Benjamin provided a fundamental idea of qualitative research and how to construct it, articulating the research findings by mapping with the respective research questions as it requires careful data management skills. The session became more interesting and beneficial to the postgraduated when he started to share his research experience and slides showing the examples of result NVivo outputs, theme and sub-themes illustrations and different approaches in the discussion from his PhD thesis. He shares some common points that researchers might underestimate its importance, such as a nonverbal expression or organizing coded data. Dr. Benjamin recommended that researchers flexibly balance four items in this part: Explanation, Evidence, Support paper, and Theme. Dr. Rupam Konar, the Programme Director - M.Sci. Tourism in SHTE and one of the Associate Director in CRiT managed the interactive Q&A section whereby Dr. Benjamin used his research to showcase and answer all the questions of the audience about timing and translation procedure. Lastly, the session fruitful ended with several practical tips for young researchers to make their post-graduate research journey successful.

The CRiT Community Engagement had a knowledgesharing session with the Department of Wildlife and National Park (DWNP) of Peninsular Malaysia. The session was conducted on 10th June 2022 at DWNP office. Dr Thanam Subramaniam, the Associate Director of Community Engagement (CRiT), presented the outcomes of her recent study on 'Transforming Eco-Tourist Experiences in Protected Area of Pahang: Going Memorable and Smart'. In her presentation, she highlighted the need and benefits of technology implementation in enhancing eco-tourist experiences in ecotourism destinations. YBhg. Dato' Abdul Kadir bin Abu Hashim (Director General of DWNP), Prof Ahmad Shuib (Senior Research Fellow of Taylor's University), Dr Chia Kei Wei (Senior Lecturer, Taylor's University) and several officers of DWNP participated in this knowledge-sharing session.

At the end of the presentation, Dr Thanam shared a sample of a smart tourism mobile application initiated by Tourism Management students at Taylor's University. YBhg. # **Networking Session with Tourism Stakeholders**

The tourism industry is one of the first affected and last recovered industries from the outbreak COVID 19 pandemic. Although the industry started to bounce back, the pandemic provided tremendous changes in tourist behaviour and enhanced the necessity of technology in tourism services. In line with that, the CRiT Community Engagement team is organising two networking sessions with tourism stakeholders to understand the challenges the tourism stakeholders face in the current situation and design suitable collaboration strategies for upcoming community engagement projects between tourism stakeholders, including students. Hence, the first session was conducted on 15th June 2022 at Taylor's University Lakeside Campus. Around 13 tourism stakeholders from tourism operators, travel agencies, tourism researchers and academicians participated in this session.

Dr. Puvaneswaran Kunasekaran was invited as the session's facilitator, and he executed the "Action Learning" method to initiate the discussion to ground the issues facing the tourism stakeholders in the current situation. All stakeholders actively participated in the session and listed various issues and challenges they currently face. In addition, Dr Puvaneswaran clarified the power of asking questions in identifying the root cause of the issues and challenges. It was a very fruitful session for the tourism stakeholders when they identified and listed various issues and challenges in the brainstorming session before strategizing potential actions in the next session.



# **Networking Session with Tourism Stakeholders**

The second part of the networking of tourism stakeholders was conducted on 22nd June 2022 at University Lakeside Taylor's Campus. networking session was initiated to share the outcome of research on 'Transforming eco-tourists experiences in protected are of Pahang: Going memorable and smart', highlighting the importance of integrating tourism services with technology. The researcher also presented the sample tourism mobile app, which a group of tourism students proposed as an endemic recovery strategy. Tourism stakeholders' feedback on the proposed app was collected for improvement. Most of them welcomed the proposed idea and provided suggestions for improvement from practical perspectives.

Safety and security, convenient and user-friendly, niche tourism activity categories such as heritage, historical, community, ecotourism, cultural tourism, religious tourism and a directory of tourism authorities were a few of their suggestions to be included in the app. At the end of the session, the project team leader highlighted the necessity of technology integration in providing memorable and unforgettable tourism experiences to the tourists as the next recovery step that they should take into consideration to sustain their services in the tourism industry.
