

Postgraduate Research Colloquium (PGRC) 2022 was organized by the Faculty of Social Sciences and Leisure Management (FSLM), Taylor's University, virtually, on 5th - 6th November 2022 in collaboration with local and international institutions; Centre for Research and Innovation in Tourism (CRiT), Malaysia; Taylor's Toulouse University Center (TTUC), Malaysia; Universiti Teknologi MARA (UiTM), Shah Alam, Malaysia; Lovely Professional University, India; University of Northampton, United Kingdom; Institute of Tourism and Hotel Management, Far Eastern University, Philippines; Institute of Education, Far Eastern University, Philippines; University of Kota, India; Banasthali Vidyapith, India; ISTHIA, University Toulouse Jean Jaures (UT2J), France; Universitas Bunda Mulia, Indonesia; School of Hospitality & Tourism, Universitas Pelita Harapan, Indonesia; J.H Cerilles State College Pagadian City, Philippines; Universitas Indonesia.

One hundred twenty-three extended abstracts were presented by research scholars from various countries, including Bangladesh, China, Ethiopia, Hungary, India, Indonesia, Malaysia, Myanmar, Nigeria, Oman, the Philippines, Saudi Arabia, Sri Lanka, and Vietnam under the streams of Hospitality, Tourism & Events, Education and Gastronomy & Food Studies in 31 breakout rooms. Besides research presentations, six workshops were conducted:

- 1. Experience sharing session by Ph.D. alumni
- 2. What is a case study?
- 3. Theoretical and conceptual framework in Social Sciences Research
- 4. Writing Manuscripts for journal publication
- 5. Being an early career researcher: perspectives, experiences, and challenges
- 6. Postgraduate Programmes by Research in the Faculty of Social Sciences and Leisure Management, Taylor's University, Malaysia.

In total, the PGRC 2022 was attended by over 700 participants from 34 different nations, including Australia, Bangladesh, Bolivia, China, Egypt, Ethiopia, Fiji, France, Ghana, Hungary, India, Indonesia, Iran, Kenya, Kyrgyzstan, Morocco, Malaysia, Maldives, Nepal, Nigeria, Oman, Pakistan, Philippines, Portugal, South Africa, Sri Lanka, Senegal, Saudi Arabia, Spain, Singapore, Turkey, Thailand, United Kingdom, Uzbekistan, Vietnam.

Trends and Future Research Agenda of Tourism and Hospitality

with Visiting Scholars Emeritus Prof. Dr. Jafar Jafari and Dr. Raymond Rastegar



The Sustainable Tourism Impact Lab, the Centre for Research and Innovation in tourism (CRiT), and the School of Hospitality, Tourism, and Events (SHTE) jointly organized five sessions (F2F and ZOOM) with the Visiting Scholars - Emeritus Professor Dr. Jafar Jafari (University of Wisconsin-Stout, USA) and Dr. Raymond Rastegar, (University of Queensland, Australia). The two-day event on November 24 and 25, 2022 involved five knowledge-sharing and extensive discussion sessions on the following topics:

- Tourism and Justice: Trends and Future Research Agenda
- Writing an International Grant Proposal
- 1-to-1 Session for Joint Publication
- Future of Tourism (Post-COVID) Bridging Theory and Practice in Tourism and Hospitality
- Qualitative Research Methods Workshop for Social Sciences

Tourism and Justice: Trends and Future Research Agenda

On November 24, 2022, Thursday, the morning session was presented by Dr. Raymond Rastegar on the topic "Tourism and Justice: Trends and Future Research Agenda," During the session, Dr. Raymond covered the Justice discourse in tourism, the conceptualization of justice informing multispecies justice in tourism research and practice. He shared about the different goals, decision-making, and lack of collaboration from his published article titled "Tourism and justice: Rethinking the role of governments," Annals of Tourism Research. He highlighted the importance of moving from human-centered tourism to the planet (human & non-human) centered tourism and shared his recently published article proposing the justice framework to guide tourism recovery using 4 principles of justice, including Recognition justice, Procedural justice, Distributive justice, and Restorative justice.









Writing an International Grant Proposal (Closed Session)

The second session on November 24, 2022, Thursday afternoon was focused on "Writing an International Grant Proposal" whereby two teams headed by Dr Chia Kei Wei and Assoc. Prof. Dr. Kandappan with their members - Dr. Rupam Konar, Dr. Thanam Subramaniam, Dr. Nagathisen Katahenggam, Dr. Stephanie Chuah Hui Wen, Dr. Tee Lee Hong, Dr. Ellie Chee Shi Yin, and Prof. Dr. Ahmad Bin Shuib shared their team ideas. After sharing their ideas, the visiting scholars extended their ideas into a greater discussion covering various parameters. Finally, they advised the tourism team to focus the research grants on the impact of tourism on forest resources/community, agriculture fishery - Government collaborating with National Government International funding, Innovation/Technology Community/Tourism development, and writing policy paper for the ASEAN regions through UNWTO and the hospitality team to focus on water management, technology, and innovation to benefit the hospitality industry.





1-to-1 Session for Joint Publication (Closed Session)

On November 24 and 25, 2022 (Thursday & Friday), a "1-to-1 Session for Joint Publication" with Dr. Raymond Rastegar from the University of Queensland Business School, Australia, was organized. This session was purposed to allow interested participants to discuss a joint publication with Dr. Raymond Rastegar, which involved an in-depth discussion of the title and abstracts. His research focuses on sustainable tourism development in developing countries with a specific interest in local community livelihood, participation, empowerment, and environmental conservation.

Future of Tourism (Post-COVID) Bridging Theory and Practice in Tourism and Hospitality

On November 25, 2022 (Friday), a session entitled "Future of Tourism (Post-COVID) Bridging Theory and Practice in Tourism and Hospitality" with the Visiting Professor - Emeritus Professor Dr. Jafar Jafari (University of Wisconsin-Stout, USA) was organized. During the session, Emeritus Professor Dr. Jafar Jafari, covered tourism's road mapping (ups and down) by sharing his personal journey since 80' and his significant contributions to the tourism industry. He also focused on tourism intelligence, hospitality, and the tourism industry knowledge bank and concept of putting theory into practice. Also, Professor Dr. Jafar Jafari highlighted the evolution of the tourism industry, especially after WWII, and stressed the importance of the tourism industry and the lessons learned during/after COVID-19. He shared the major gap in-between theory and practice in the hospitality and tourism industry by introducing his book series

"Bridging Tourism Theory and Practice" with Emerald. https://www.emerald.com/insight/publication/issn/2042-1443.





As an outcome of the session, the book entitled "Theory and Practice in Hospitality and Tourism Research: An ASEAN Context" will be edited under Prof. Jafari's book series by Co-editor; Dr. Jeetesh Kumar and Dr. Rupam Konar. The proposed book will focus on case studies from ASEAN countries having joint contributions by academia, practitioners, and policymakers.













Qualitative Research Methods Workshop for Social Sciences

The afternoon topic was "Qualitative Research Methods Workshop for Social Sciences" by Dr. Raymond Rastegar. This was a hybrid workshop session where 58 students from various disciplines joined online, and 27 students joined face to face in this session. This session was moderated by Dr. Rupam Konar from the School of Hospitality, Tourism, and Events (SHTE). Dr. Raymond began the session with his philosophical stance on the qualitative research approach. More specifically, his presentation highlighted what is a research question?; defining focus through the research questions; developing research questions. He used an interesting "elevator story" technique to engage all participants to write and explain their research questions. Dr. Raymond furthered the session by highlighting the common features of the qualitative research approach. Finally, the session concluded with a fruitful 45 minutes Q&A session where participants shared their experiences, ideas, and methodology-related challenges.








6TH WORLD TOURISM CONFERENCE (WTC) 2022




Collaboration for Research Amidst Pandemic and ASEAN Perspectiive

On 23 November 2022. Dr. Thanam Subramaniam. Senior Lecturer and Associate Director for Community Engagement of the Center for Research and Innovation in Tourism (CRiT), Taylor's University Malaysia, was invited to serve as a Resource Speaker for the 2nd Research Extension Week 2022 with a theme of "Research and Extension Excellence in the New Normal: Engaging in Societal Research and Meaningful Extension Activities," organized by Cavite State University - Cavite College of Arts and Trades (CCTA) Campus. The session was conducted online via Facebook live and Cisco Webex. During the plenary Speech, Dr. Thanam delivered insights on "Collaboration for Research Amidst Pandemic and ASEAN Perspectiive' covering the potential new research topics among ASEAN researchers, including lessons learned from COVID-19, sustainable tourism, technologies/ innovation, travelers' experiences, industry engagement/ integration, student learning, academic collaboration and medical /health and wellness tourism. Dr. Jerico Tadeo, the Director of Research and Extension of Cavite State University, moderated the session. Around 250 participants were actively involved in these online and Q&A sessions.

Back to the Future Reconfiguring the World of Business and Technology through Education and Research

Dr. Rupam Konar was invited as a 'Guest Speaker' for the 5th Global Conference on Business and Technology (GCBT-2022), London, UK on 4th November 2022 to share on "Back to the Future Reconfiguring the world of Business and Technology through Education and Research." Where participants joined from different institutions across the globe, he shared the different aspects of education technologies currently being used across different universities globally and what is now being practiced at Taylor's University as part of the academic and non-academic curriculum for the students. Further, he also highlighted in his talk how technologies are augmenting the current educators to deliver holistic education for the students.

This conference took place at the Cottage by the Sea Langkawi by Frangipani (CBTS), and the Malaysia Green Building Council (malaysiaGBC) will be the co-organizer for this conference.


Youth for Tourism and Hospitality International Conference (Y4TH) 2022: Tourism Reimagined


